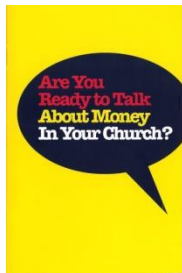

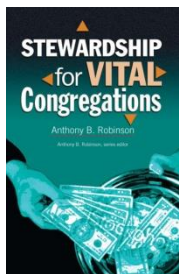


Faith Practices

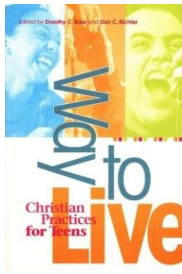

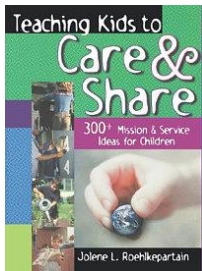
