NHCUCC WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP SPRING GATHERING MARCH 25, 2017 BY BARBARA HALL UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST IN KEENE

The Women's Fellowship of UCC-Keene was delighted to host the Spring Annual Meeting of the NHCUCC Women's Fellowship on Saturday, March 25. There were 66 women in attendance from all over the state. With several husbands on parking duty, there were places for everyone. The fellowship began in the dining room at the registration and white elephant tables. Coffee and muffins were served in the parlor until worship began at 10:00 a.m. in the sanctuary.

There was a short introduction describing the church's iconic role in the city of Keene and the major renovation project taking place on the ground floor. The service was highlighted by music of the Ringers on the Square, led by bell choir director Diantha Dorman. Readings came from the 2017 International Women's Day and World Day of Prayer liturgies. The offering (over \$250) was presented to the Keene Community Kitchen. Communion was led by Pastor Cindy Bagley, newly installed senior minister and the first woman to be called to that position in Keene. "Leaving a Legacy of Love" was the title of Pastor Cindy's program for the day. She encouraged a discussion of how we pass along our values—not just our valuables.

Luncheon followed in the dining room, with sandwiches and salads for all. Those who found a sticker under their dinner plate got to take home the fresh daffodils on the table.

The annual meeting was held after dessert. Three new "Outstanding Women" were honored, including a very surprised President Diane Wells.

The afternoon was spent in the parlor as Pastor Cindy presented a form she developed for assessing values and sharing them with others. Small groups joined in discussions until the closing hymn, "Bless Be the Tie That Binds." Amen to that.

OUTSTANDING WOMEN RECOGNITION

Each year prior to the NHCUCC Women's Fellowship Spring Gathering anyone from a NH UCC church may fill out a form recommending the name of a person they consider to be an outstanding woman in their church. FALL OVERNIGHT RETREAT IMPORTANT INFORMATION

NO LINENS ARE SUPPLIED—you will have to bring a sleeping bag or sheets, blankets, pillows, towels, and wash cloths. You might also want to bring a flashlight, mosquito repellant—non-aerosol, and maybe a folding chair—although there are plenty of benches around. There is also a small camp store.

Camp Sentinel is located in the foothills of the Ossipee Mountain range in Center Tuftonboro, New Hampshire. Sentinel hosts year round rustic retreats and is known for its home-cooked meals, attention to detail, and Christian hospitality. Amenities include: five unique hiking trails, 5-element ropes course with zip line, giant swing, 25-foot tall rock climbing wall, large field, archery range, chapel for up to 200 guests, and more. The camp provides solitude on its 645 acres and over a mile of water frontage on crystal clear Dan Hole Pond, formed from a former volcano. It is just minutes from Lake Winnipesauke, North Conway shopping outlets, and family attractions.

Some basic policy rules:

- No alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs are allowed on the grounds.
- Smoking is not allowed in any building or on the grounds.
- No pets are allowed.
- The property and buildings must be left clean and all furniture returned to original place upon departure.

There are three to seven beds in each room in the lodge. There are bathrooms on the main floor and the third floor. There are three-plus beds in each cabin. Most cabins do not have bathroom facilities within—there are outside bathrooms shared by all the cabins.

VIA SEACOAST: Off Route 16 onto Route 171 for about 8 miles to Camp Sentinel sign, turn right onto Canaan Road. Turn right at the top of the hill into the camp.

VIA WOLFEBORO: Bear left off Route 28 onto Route 109A to Tuftonboro School (8 miles), then right on Ledgehill Road for 3 miles to Route 171. Turn left on Route 171 for ¼ mile. Look for the Camp Sentinel sign and turn right on Canaan Road. Turn right at the top of the hill into the camp.

VIA I-93: Travel towards Meredith. Go East on Route 104 to Route 3. Left on Route 3 to stop lights in Meredith Center. Right on Route 25 to Route 109. Right on Route 109 to Route 171 (Left at fork). After 6 to 7 miles, look for the Camp Sentinel sign, turn left onto Canaan Road. Turn right at the top of the hill into the camp.

TRUDIE BERGERON from Greenland NH went to her first Celebration in Portland in 2014. She attended two workshops—one she didn't like, and one she loved. The one she loved was Art for the Soul—making a prayer chain with Kristin Putney. Her first thought was, Why are Protestants making a prayer chain with beads? She wanted to find out the answer. And she did. When the Greenland attendees returned, the Pastor asked us to give a report during one of the Lenten programs. Ten of us reported. Trudie was still excited about the prayer chain she made, as was Evelyn Sammel excited about the prayer chain she made. Donna Lee Lewis, President of the Women's Alliance asked Trudie to show the women of the church how to make a prayer chain. Trudie was so excited about this idea that she immediately started buying beads at Michaels and JoAnn's, and anywhere else she found beads that she especially liked. Since Celebration IX, she did Prayer Bead workshops at the Greenland church, other churches, and our Fall Gathering in Rindge in 2015. She will again bring beads to Tuftonboro in September 2017. And Kristin Putney will be doing two more Prayer Chain workshops at Celebration X—sign up early so you don't miss out!

REMEMBER WHEN ELLEN MACLELLAN from Concord NH came to the Woodbound Inn in Rindge in 2015 with her labyrinth? Well, she's going to Celebration X in Portland ME on April 7, 2018. If you missed our retreat in Rindge, now is another opportunity to hear what she has to say about her labyrinth. If you did hear her, spread the word and encourage others to go to Celebration X in Portland in April 2018 to walk Eleanor's labyrinth. ELEANOR MACLELLAN—SOLE TO SOUL—Eleanor MacLellan helps women use guided storytelling in small groups to share their faith journeys. An active church member, her faith was shaken in the midst of a serious family crisis. During that time, she worked with five other women to create a large portable labyrinth for her church and community. As the women worked, they shared the stories of their spiritual journeys. In her memoir, Sole to Soul, Finding a Path toward Loving Accompaniment, Eleanor recounts those stories and others to demonstrate not only that a very active Holy Spirit is working in our daily lives, but also that we can find parables in our own times that illustrate the central Christian message of loving accompaniment. Eleanor has considerable experience traversing life's labyrinthine paths. Like many of us, she has dealt with divorce, remarriage, and community activities.


